CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

OUTPATIENT/CLINIC PROGRAMS:

These clinics provide psychological testing, psychiatric evaluations, medication prescriptions and on-going medication monitoring for children diagnosed with a mental health disabilities. The treatment staff also provides individual, family, and play/art therapy at the clinic site. Outpatient/clinic level care is typically funded through private insurance or Medical Assistance.

PARTIAL HOSPITALIZATION PROGRAMS:

These programs provide psychological testing, psychiatric evaluations, medication prescriptions and on-going medication monitoring for children diagnosed with mental health disabilities. The treatment staffs provide individual, family, group, and recreational therapy. There also is an educational component with this program. There are three types of partial hospitalization programs for children and adolescents: day time partials that keep school hours during the school year and business hours during the summer months; after school hour's partials; and, acute partials. For all three types of partials, transportation is typically provided by the providing agency or the school district. Partial Hospitalization Programs are typically funded through private insurance or Medical Assistance.

<u> ACUTE PARTIAL HOSPITALIZATION PROGRAMS:</u>

Referrals originate in the mental health system. These programs are usually used as a step down treatment from a hospitalization or as a device to prevent hospitalization. Programming is during school hours, typically six hours each week day. These programs provide psychological testing, psychiatric evaluations, medication prescriptions, on-going medication monitoring and diagnostic work up for children diagnosed with mental health disabilities. These programs provide individual, family, and group therapy. There is an educational component to this program as well. Transportation is typically provided by the provider or the school district. The typical stay is 2-6 weeks. Acute Partial Hospitalization Programs can be funded through private insurance or Medical Assistance.

IN SCHOOL PARTIAL HOSPITALIZATION PROGRAMS:

Referrals originate in the school system. This program provides psychiatric evaluations, medication prescriptions and medication monitoring. The therapists provide individual, family and group therapy at the school location. This program is funded by some private insurance, by Medical Assistance and by the school district. Hours of programming typically match school hours. The provider or school districts provide transportation.

AFTER SCHOOL PARTIALS:

Referrals originate in the mental health system. This program is available to medically appropriate school age children and adolescents. The program provides psychiatric evaluations, prescriptions for medication, and medication monitoring. In addition, the therapists provide individual, family, and group therapy at the treatment site location. This program is funded by some private insurance and by Medical Assistance.

<u>BEHAVIORAL HEALTH REHABILITATIVE SERVICES (BHRS)/ PROVIDER 50</u> (P 50) PROGRAMS:

BHRS/P50 services are intensive mental health therapies that are provided in the child's home, in community settings and occasionally in the classroom. This program often provides psychiatric evaluations, medication prescriptions, and medication monitoring. These services are often a mix of therapies: the client in sessions alone, the client in sessions with his/her parents; the client in session with his/her siblings; and the client in sessions with the whole family.

Rarely are BHRS/P50 services the first treatment a client receives. Most commonly a client has been treated in a clinic or partial hospitalization program and those treatments were not enough to produce improvement in the child's behavior or emotional health. These services are characterized as individually tailored, creative, flexible, non-traditional services based on "whatever it takes" to keep a child with a serious disorder at home, in school, and in the community.

There are three types of therapists commonly employed in this program:

- Mobile Therapist (MT) a Master's degree clinician that provides therapy in the home, with intensity and duration tailored to the individual child's need. The therapy sessions are based upon the "inner" emotions and the "inner" causes of problems. The MT can work directly with family members to address past traumas and other appropriate issues that have an impact on the child or family system. This clinician can directly supervise the Therapeutic Support Staff.
- Behavioral Specialist Consultant (BSC) a Master's degree clinician with specific expertise needed to assist the family, teachers, other mental health staff, or other child-servicing systems in managing the child's behaviors through behavioral modification techniques. The BSC designs a reward or reinforcements and a penalty system for the client's behavior that helps the client feel motivated to behave in a healthy way. The BSC also directly consults with the parents in addressing parenting styles and techniques. This clinician/consultant directly supervises the Therapeutic Support Staff.
- Therapeutic Support Staff (TSS) has a Bachelor's degree and carries out therapeutic
 activities that are designed and supervised by one of the Master's degree clinicians.

They provide one-on-one interventions in the home, school, or community, when the behavior without this intervention would require a more restrictive level of treatment. The TSS follows through on the Behavioral Modification programs designed by the BSC as well as offering support and role modeling to family members and other involved adults.

This program is rarely if ever funded through private insurance. This program is most often funded through Medical Assistance.

FUNCTIONAL FAMILY THERAPY (FFT):

This program is a research based prevention and intervention program for at-risk adolescents and their families that target youths between the ages of 11 and 18. It is a short-term family based program that can be used for a range of adolescent problems, including violence, drug abuse, conduct disorder and family conflict.

This therapy is an outcome driven prevention/intervention program for youths who have demonstrated the entire range of maladaptive, acting out behaviors and related syndromes. Treatment occurs in phases where each step builds on one another to enhance protective factors and reduce risk by working with both the youths and their family. The phases are engagement, motivation, assessment, behavior change, and generalization.

These services can be delivered in a variety of settings. For example, it is used for runaway or truant youth, and as an alternate to detention for first time misdemeanors.

MULITSYSTEMIC THERAPY (MST):

This therapy is an intensive family and community based therapy that targets chronic violent or substance abusing juvenile offenders at high risk of out-of-home placement. It is provided using a home-based model of service delivery, and duration of treatment in about four months. The major goal is MST is to enable parents to address the issues of their child and to empower youth to cope with family, peer, school, and neighborhood problems. Other goals include reducing criminal activity, reducing other types of antisocial behavior, and achieving these outcomes at a cost savings.

MST differs for other family-based treatment models in four ways: it emphasizes factors in the adolescent and family's social networks that are linked with antisocial behaviors; it has programs with a strong commitment to removing barriers to access to services; it's intensity of treatment is greater than other family-based therapies; and there are well-documented, long-term outcomes.

IN-HOME FAMILY BASED MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAMS (FBMHS):

This program is designed as a six to nine month time limited program. It provides psychiatric evaluations, medication prescriptions, medication monitoring, and team counseling. As the name of the program indicates, the focus is on the family, not just the needs of the child. The therapist may deal with family members individually, particular family members together, or address the whole family. The goal is to break up long standing and unsuccessful ways of relating to each other and resolving problems. Each family member has a plan for treatment during the six months. This program takes place in the home, community and school settings and provides a 24-hour on-call for crisis situations.

There is a team of two therapists who work together and nearly always comes to the home together. Each team can only treat eight families at a time. One therapist has a Master's degree and the other has a Bachelor's degree. The number and type of sessions vary with the need of the family and may change over the course of the six months. There are no set hours of treatment per week; hours of treatment vary depending on the family's needs.

This program is rarely if ever funded through private insurance. Medical Assistance is almost always the primary insurance for funding coverage.

FAMILY FOCUSED SOLUTION BASED SERVICE (FFSBS):

This program provides services in the home and community setting to assist child/youth with succeeding in the home, community and school settings. This service will also work cooperatively with the involved child welfare and juvenile justice entities to identify any unmet family support needs in order to improve the overall stability of the home environment and prevent out-of-home placement for the child/adolescent. FFSBS have expertise in both behavioral health treatment and child welfare services.

This program is a nine to twelve month long program that offers a 24 on-call service. Services will be provided by a team consisting of a master's level therapist and a bachelor's level family support staff person, at intensity on the severity of the family issues and needs.

COMMUNITY RESIDENTIAL REHABILITATIVE HOST HOMES (CRR):

This program provides private residences licensed by the state to offer a structured living arrangement that also provides mental health treatment. These homes usually have one to three children with a mental health diagnosis as well as any natural children of the host family. The child lives with the host parents who provide the structure, support, and the therapeutic milieu needed to provide psychosocial/psychiatric rehabilitation. This program is designed to provide a highly structured, safe and secure setting for individuals with mental health diagnosis who are at risk of long-term out of home placements or

inpatient hospitalizations. The program provides a less restrictive alternative to institutional care or out of county placement. Services focus on assisting the consumer in better managing stressors through community resident care and are geared toward facilitating a return to the family. In addition, the program seeks to connect individuals with other supports which will assist them in remaining in the community.

The actual therapeutic sessions are provided by the agency's therapists. The agency also provides psychiatric care for the prescription of psychotropic medications and for their monitoring.

This program is rarely funded by private insurance. The primary insurance is typically Medical Assistance.

MULTIDIMENSIONAL TREATMENT FOSTER CARE (MTFC):

This program offers an alternative to Residential or group home settings for youths between the ages of 12-18 years of age with chronic juvenile delinquency. Youth involved with MTFC often show emotional and behavioral problems that present a challenge. Through a collaborative effort by the treatment team, the program focuses on decreasing anti-social behaviors and increasing developmentally appropriate social skills and behaviors to help youth experience success at home, at school and in the community.

This program offers 24/7 support by Program Supervisor for the treatment foster parents, and the youth, weekly treatment foster parent meetings to review the youth's behavioral plan and make changes as necessary to aid the youth' success, and weekly individual and family therapy.

The average length of stay is approximately 6-9 months. This may vary depending upon the individual treatment plans.

NON-JCAHO RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT FACILITIES (GROUP HOMES):

This program is a 24-hour supervised group home setting designed to include psychiatric assessment, medication prescriptions and medication monitoring. The group homes provide a highly structured, safe and secure environment for individuals with mental health disabilities. These children are at risk of long-term out of home placement or inpatient hospitalization. This program provides a less restrictive alternative to institutional care or out of county placement. Education is offered off grounds in the local school district. The mental health staffs are licensed therapists and are at the group home around the clock. These group homes are state licensed.

This program is seldom funded by private insurance. The primary insurance is typically Medical Assistance.

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT FACILITIES (RTF):

This type of psychiatric treatment facility for children and adolescents provides comprehensive mental health treatment to children and adolescents who, due to mental illness or severe emotional disturbance, are in need of quality active treatment that can be provided only in a psychiatric residential facility and for whom alternative, less restrictive forms of treatment have been unsuccessful or are not medically indicated. Children and adolescents who receive these services have been recommended by a psychiatrist and also reviewed by the CASSP team to determine that there are no appropriate alternative treatments available.

These services are offered in a 24-hour/day program where the child receives intensive and structured mental health services, and where education is provided on grounds. These facilities are state licensed and provide psychiatric care on grounds with mental health professionals around the clock.

Active treatment starts with intakes and assessments that form the basis for treatment and includes discharge planning. Active treatment includes ongoing family involvement in the planning for and delivery of services. In active treatment, programming is individualized to the needs of each resident and the family to maximize individual functioning in activities of daily living, education and vocational preparation.

The psychiatric residential treatment facility is expected to appropriately treat a child, document the delivery and response to treatment, and provide or obtain to the extent possible, all services the child needs while a resident of the facility. Services provided by the facility must be built on the competencies of the child and the family, while addressing specific needs, e.g., culture, treatment history, family relationships, etc.

These programs are often covered for a brief time by private insurances. However, Medical Assistance is typically the primary insurance after private insurance is exhausted.
