## Tech Trends that Parents Should Know About

Have you ever heard of ChatGPT? It is a communication app, but probably not how you think. ChatGPT is a new open-source artificial intelligence that allows people to enter a question (or essay prompt or request) and have the computer, using artificial intelligence, craft a well-written response that sounds like a human wrote it.

This app could have an impact on teachers and classrooms because students could enter an essay prompt and have the AI craft the essay for them and then submit it. The text created by the AI is so close to real human language that it cannot be confirmed by a program like Turnitin or even by the teacher's eye.

While I understand that we live in a hyper-connected world with instant access to answers, images, media, and so much more, I wanted to take a moment and address where we at SLHS stand. Our mission has always been: **Learning. Serving. Leading. One Interaction at a Time.** Every educator in this building acknowledges and works to adjust our classrooms to the world we live in and use every available tool that could aid in helping every student learn, serve, and lead. While ChatGPT is one of the newest and most powerful tools, we do not want the use of that tool to overshadow and replace the essence of that tool; helping students express themselves with their voice.

While it is acceptable and understood that students will use ChatGPT to help break through writer's block and help them develop ideas for their work, ChatGPT should never be used and submitted by any student as their original work. We are committed to all of our students developing skills that will aid them in the real world, like critical thinking, problem-solving, effective and honest communication and so much more. We look forward to working with you as a partner to help every student see the value in developing their voice, their skills, and maintain academic integrity in all their work.

## Attendance

Please be advised that the following protocol will be followed when visitors enter SLHS. Visitors will only enter through the main entrance.

- Visitors will identify themselves and must provide picture ID for verification.
- Visitor will state their intended destination in the building.
- The HS Greeter will call to confirm the appointment and get approval for any unexpected visitor. If the visit is unapproved or the recipient is unavailable. The visitor will be asked to call to make an appointment and return another time. The visitor will not be permitted to enter the building.
- If approved, the visitor will be issued a visitor's badge that must be worn in the building.

When the visit is complete, the visitor will proceed directly to the main entrance without making any other stops, return the visitor's badge and exit the building.

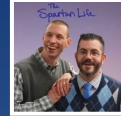
#### NHS Student Tutoring:

# 2023-2024 COURSE SELECTION

On January 23<sup>rd</sup>, the SLSD School Board will be voting on the approval and adoption of the 2023-2024 SLHS Program of Studies. With that approval, course selection for the 2023-2024 school year will begin for all underclassmen. Teachers will make recommendations for appropriate placement based on multiple data points, course prerequisites, and even potentially entrance exams. After viewing the teachers' recommendations, students and parents will electronically submit course requests. Parental review of their student's choices are important. Following the submission, students will meet individually with their counselors to review and finalize their course requests. Late in the spring, we will send home a tentative schedule. Parents and students should review that sheet to see what the next school year will potentially look like and that as many course requests were honored as possible.

The administration reserves the right to withdraw a course offering if a reasonable number of students do not elect the course or if staffing is not available. Remember, building a balanced schedule is one of the most important things you can do as a high school student. Challenge yourself to try new things and expand your horizons. We hope you have a successful school year and we are here to help guide you in any way we can.

### Course Selection Process Timeline:

- **Late January:** Counselors will provide an overview of course selection information to students in grade level meetings during Spartan Period.
- **Late January:** Teachers will discuss course options with students in class and will enter course recommendations in Sapphire for each student.
- **Early February:** Students will have a one week window of time to input course requests into Sapphire for next school year. During this time, students should speak with their parents/guardians regarding course requests and should carefully consider teacher recommendations & course prerequisites.
- **February-May:** Students will have the opportunity to discuss course requests with their counselor.
- **June:** Students will be provided with a tentative schedule.
- **June 15:** Deadline for students to make changes to schedules.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- Please note that Math & Science teacher recommendations are based on performance in current classes only. Grade prerequisites for courses taken in previous years will be verified by the guidance office.
- Core subject teachers will be recommending courses directly in Sapphire.
- You will need to enter your courses directly into Sapphire
- You must schedule a **MINIMUM OF 7 CREDITS** and may select a maximum of 8 credits.
- Please read the course descriptions in the *Program of Studies* and be aware of course prerequisites.
- Courses marked with "DE" indicates a dual enrollment course and those marked with an "\*" indicates a weighted course.
- **ALL SCHEDULE CHANGES MUST BE MADE BY JUNE 15th**



# Dual Enrollment UPDATE

In Issue 2 of the Principal's Newsletter I provided the outline for all families on the structure we have for our Dual enrollment options here at Southern Lehigh High School. With the semester turnover occurring on January 20<sup>th</sup>, it is important that a review of current Dual Enrollment courses is covered as well as some updates for the 2023-2024 school year.

For students who are currently enrolled in Dual Enrollment courses or scheduled to take a Dual Enrollment eligible course in the Spring, here are your updates:

- Students who are currently enrolled in year-long courses with Dual Enrollment capability through Seton Hall, may have additional registration for the Spring semester. These students will receive information from their teachers during the first week of second semester to move forward with that process.
- Students who are in year long courses that have Dual Enrollment Capability with University of Pitt and LCCC will not have to complete any additional registration for the Spring semester.
- Students who are in first semester courses with Dual Enrollment capability with LCCC should follow-up with their teacher to make sure all course requirements are completed to receive credit.
- Students who are going to start second semester courses with Dual Enrollment capability with LCCC will begin the registration process with that teacher once the semester begins.
- At the conclusion of your course, whether it is year long or semester based, students must go directly to Seton Hall Project Acceleration, University of Pitt College in High School, or LCCC Dual Enrollment webpages to request official transcripts for their final grades.

For all students that are not scheduled in Dual Enrollment courses currently or for the Spring semester, here is a breakdown of what you can do or should think about.

- Seniors who are not currently in any Dual Enrollment capable courses and want to earn credits for college prior to graduation should look specifically at our Mansfield University Early Start Program. Their Spring semester courses are open and students can register.

While making the choice to enroll in Dual Enrollment courses is not always the easiest one, there are some benefits to taking these courses, such as:

- Less time required after high school to finish a college degree
- Provides students with a head start on the college experience
- Dual-enrollment classes often save students money on tuition
- Students may be able to transfer credits earned to a four-year school
- Students may choose from classes not currently available at their high school

Whatever the choice, it is good to consult with your Guidance counselor during the course selection process. The Program of Studies is renewed annually and is always adding additional Dual Enrollment opportunities that align to our current program and provide students valuable opportunities.

## SENIOR MEETING ON JANUARY 24<sup>th</sup>

On January 9<sup>th</sup> the SLSD School Board was notified by Dr. Mahon that Stabler Arena was secured for SLHS Graduation for Friday June 2<sup>nd</sup>. On Monday, January 23<sup>rd</sup> the SLSD School Board will vote to approve the contract and secure the location and date of SLHS Graduation.

Following that approval, the senior class will have a meeting with SLHS Administration to cover the following items for the second half of their senior year:

- Senior Dues
- Senior Final Exam Schedule
- Senior Sunset
- Graduation Practice Schedule
- Graduation Ceremony Updates

Following the meeting with students, parents will receive a BlackBoard Connect detailing specifics that were shared with the students to help senior families prepare for the final stretch of their time at SLHS.
